Civil Procedure

Teach required first-year course examining the rules governing procedure for state and federal civil claims from the preparation of and filing of a claim through trial. Teach subject matter and personal jurisdiction. Deliver traditional doctrinal lectures while incorporating practice-based perspectives and in-class exercises, including complaint drafting, discovery exercises, and simulated depositions.

Torts

Teach required first-year course analyzing civil liability for unintended and intentional harms as well as liability without fault. Lecture on traditional tort law while incorporating practice-based perspectives and in-class exercises. Design and implement experiential assignments, including simulated client interviews, complaint drafting, memorandum drafting, and other lawyering tasks related to substantive issues covered in class.

Advanced Torts Seminar

Teach writing seminar analyzing traditional and innovative approaches to negligence and intentional torts, with a focus on products liability, intentional torts, and New Mexico practice. Teach classes on substantive torts. Supervise student writing process on a variety of torts topics. Structure and facilitate paper presentations and workshops. Invite guest speakers to present on high-profile local civil cases.

Immigrants' Rights Seminar

Teach writing seminar examining the rights of non-citizens in the context of a variety of substantive areas of domestic law, including the effect of immigration status on eligibility for public benefits, health care, housing, education, employment, identification documents, and driver's licenses. Lead class discussion and supervise students in extensive research and writing projects focused on a variety of immigrants' rights issues including police power in immigration enforcement, state and local government efforts to drive immigrants from communities, and Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) raids.

Domestic Violence Seminar

Teach writing seminar examining a wide spectrum of domestic violence issues, including mandatory arrest and prosecution in domestic violence cases, lethality assessment tools used to predict serious or lethal intimate partner violence, domestic violence torts, issues facing immigrant victims of domestic violence, typologies of intimate partner violence, and the role of feminist legal theory in the development of the battered women's movement and domestic violence law.

Community Lawyering Clinic and Law Practice Clinic
