## CONTRACTS AND GRANTS:

### PROGRAM OF RESEARCH:

- My independent program of research focuses on better understanding and treating co-occurring addiction and mental illness (co-occurring disorders), especially tobacco addiction and serious mental illness. Since starting my faculty research career at Yale, I have been funded continuously on a total of 118 research grants, including as **PI on 28 research grants** (in bold, including NIH, Foundation, Philanthropy, Federal & State Agencies); as Co-I on 68 grants; as mentor on *17 NIH or other research career awards* (in italics); & as PI/Co-PI on 2 Center Grants.
- The overarching questions guiding my program of research are:
  1. What impact does co-occurring mental illness & addiction have on clinical course and outcomes? - including biological, psychological, and social / environmental factors
  2. What clinical, organizational, and public health interventions can improve outcomes for individuals with co-occurring disorders?
  3. Can non-pharmacological interventions help individuals with behavioral health problems and their families discover personal capacities to move past mere symptom reduction to pursue and find their own meaning and purpose in life?
- My three specific areas of research focus:
  - (1) Tobacco Use Disorders and Psychiatric Co-morbidity  
Focus on schizophrenia, behavioral interventions, and dissemination & implementation science studies of my Addressing Tobacco Through Organizational Change model;
  - (2). Drug Addiction (stimulants & opioids) with & without Co-morbidity  
Focus on depression, psychosis, and pain comorbidities, including addiction clinical trials, laboratory studies of craving, and at risk populations of being homeless, during pregnancy, and health disparities. Studies of our MISSION and MCPAP for Moms models
  - (3) Recovery-Oriented Psychosocial Interventions  
Develop and study non-pharmacological interventions to help individuals & families, including Dual Recovery Therapy, Open Dialogue, & Mindfulness-Based Interventions.
- My approach involves three primary research methods:
  - (1) Quantitative & qualitative research (mixed methods) to understand clinical problems and system barriers, including translational impact with genetics & neuroimaging.
  - (2) Behavioral therapy development and clinical trials methods to develop and evaluate treatments, including treatment manuals, fidelity scales, and training programs
  - (3) Dissemination & Implementation science research methods to identify, develop, and evaluate strategies to integrate evidence based practices into public health, clinical, and community settings using organizational change and .
- The international and global impact of this research has been to increase awareness and understanding of co-occurring mental illness and addiction (especially tobacco); develop new products used globally (manuals, teaching aides, fidelity measures); change practice guidelines and policies; developed 2 research programs are recognized as “nationally effective programs” by SAMHSA NREPP (MISSION and Open Dialogue); and reduced health disparities.
- This work has resulted in authoring 315 original research articles, reviews, books, chapters, clinical practice guidelines, behavioral therapy & organizational change manuals, etc.
- Have had global research collaborations in Asia (China, Korea, Japan) and Europe (Latvia, Finland, Lithuania, Norway, UK, Denmark, and Italy).

## **Contributions to Promoting Diversity**

Throughout my 30-year career I have enhanced inclusive excellence that resulted in many personal, team, and institutional contributions to promote equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) amongst faculty, staff, and students, including increasing access, institutional and personal accountability, and creating a more welcoming and respectful climate. This work has enhanced recruitment and retention for women and URM, mentoring activities, research activities, teaching and curriculum, and community partnerships (locally and globally). These efforts include developing and implementing strategic plans and engaging large communities in a process to enhance inclusive excellence, including through existing and new organizational structures as well as conversations with individuals and groups.

My contributions have considered many dimensions of human differences and diversity, including race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, mental and physical disability, age, religion, military service, socioeconomic status, and organizational roles. Contributions in research studies have included attempts to better understand and help diverse populations or consider diversity dimensions, developing global initiatives across the world, in creating local multi-cultural clinical initiatives, and in serving on numerous community boards and developing community partnerships. As a senior leader (Associate Vice Chancellor, President, Chair, Division Director, and Board of Trustee) I have led culture change initiatives, system-wide discussions of critical diversity issues, and sponsorship.

As a first-generation Latvian American who grew up bi-culturally with immigrant parents, I am very sensitized to the impact of cultural background, acculturation and immigration. Embracing cultural humility, diversity, and being inclusive has been core values. I have led multi-cultural initiatives in research, clinical services, education, and community for students, faculty, staff, and patients.

### ***Specific Examples of EDI Contributions during the past 13 years at UC San Diego & UMass include:***

- Initiator and leader for the first Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) Summits for UCSD Health Sciences & Health with the goal to enhance strategic planning, awareness, and have individuals, teams, and the organization create action plans. I lead an Advisory Planning group of faculty, students, and staff that prepares the annual Summits, creates a catalog of best practices, provides training to teams and individuals, and has numerous workgroups on related activities. Examples of specific programs have been gender-focused and initiatives to enhance changes supportive for URM, American Indians, Hispanics/LatinX, and African Americans.
- Serve on the UCSD Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Advisory Council (Health Sciences representative) which is a campus-wide initiative for inclusive excellence. This Council advises the Vice Chancellor for EDI and the EDI office on creating a system strategic plan, new accountability meetings with each Vice Chancellor / Dean unit on UCSD campus, with a structure for public accountability on progress, new incentive plans for change, and specific program support.
- UC & UCSD Healthy Campus Network (HCN): Sponsor & Co-lead HCN and lead our work to address health disparities, inequities, and inclusive excellence, including using participatory action strategies of engaging those who would benefit from the service, “nothing for us without us” concepts, and particularly engaging the full range of diverse populations in the UC system and community.
- As a system leader at UMass, was co-leader in numerous system wide initiatives to enhance student, staff, and faculty diversity, address barriers, increase education and feedback, and expand programs within the institution. These efforts included serving on several Diversity & Inclusion Committees and sub-committees and working closely with Chief Diversity Officer, on several projects promoting

recruitment, retention, and mentoring of minority students and faculty. I initiated a leadership training on diversity and inclusion in-service, including use of Advancing Inclusion book.

- Developed and added a "Diversity Section" to annual faculty evaluations to share about activities for students, faculty, patients, recruitment, research, multi-cultural community projects, etc. After our Department successful pilot of assessing contributions to diversity, Vice Provost of Faculty Affairs added this section all faculty evaluations at the University of Massachusetts Worcester Campus (all three schools).
- Led Psychiatry Department's first Strategic Planning process, including diversity and inclusion
- The Department's Executive Committee and Leadership Team integrated Diversity as a value within our Psychiatry Strategic Planning and included in Mission, Vision and Values statement.
- Strategic plan led to range of successes in talent management (recruitment, retention, advancement, leadership) and helping faculty from diverse backgrounds to report feeling connected and belonging. Enhanced multicultural research, curriculum, global partnerships, a Multi-Cultural Academic Interest Group, and changing monthly departmental meetings to be inclusive of faculty, staff; and students where the contributions were regularly recognized.
- Achieved a more diverse workforce and in sponsoring leaders from under-represented groups which transformed our department leadership from being only white and male to 50% women & 25% minority and recruiting 20% more women and 40% more URM joining faculty, staff, and trainees.
- Sponsored Vice Chair for Research on Executive Leadership in Academic Medicine (ELAM) award and mentored on her project: "Faculty Diversity at UMass: The Road Less Traveled" in which data was collected to better understand the current climate, barriers, and support systems available to our under-represented minority faculty, leading to initiatives for recruitment and retention.
- Establishment of the Career Development and Research Office (CDRO) helping faculty in general and with specific mentoring and outreach programs for women and minorities.
- Pipeline Program of engaging with the Central MA community and URM students in local colleges and high schools to participate in several student programs in Department, including a Brain Bee, summer internships, an academic interest groups, and research mentorship programs.
- Created a Global Mental Health Office and established new formal partnerships for research, training, and consultation work in many countries. This program also aligns with our multi-culturally oriented programs for refugees and immigrants from many different cultures.



## Personal Activities in Mentoring, Research, Education, Clinical, and Other:

- **Mentoring:** At the University of Massachusetts Medical School, honored with the Woman's Faculty Award for Outstanding Mentoring to Women Faculty. The range of my mentoring with faculty and students has been helping with their career development, learning research skills, developing teaching skills, and developing clinical skills. The many faculty members I have mentored have included over 50% women, many underrepresented minorities and many from other countries.
- Successfully mentored many women (and men) and URM who have very successful academic careers, including as primary mentor for faculty with NIH, VA or other research career awards.
  - Received NIH minority supplement awards for several students and faculty on my R01 grants and have helped other faculty learn about this method to enhance their URM mentoring. .
  - Mentored faculty on Faculty Diversity Scholar Award focused on stigma and mental illness, which has led to increased focus for that person's career on internal / external stigma.
  - Served on an NIMH Minority Mentoring Program for junior faculty.
- **Research on Diversity:** Throughout my 30-year research career I have included multi-cultural research through analysis of different human dimensions (gender, ethnicity, physical disability, mental illness / physical illness, etc) with most of my publications including diversity groups.
  - As PI on the Center for Mental Health Services Research, we initiated a policy to review all grant proposals for efforts to embrace diversity and integrate cultural competence. This enhanced our applications, increased our recruitment of URM and women, led to advisory groups from the community we serve, & new areas of diversity research.
  - Research & community work with Homeless Veterans (our MISSION model) resulted in policy changes, national training programs, and reduced homelessness.
  - Research, post-doc program, and clinical services work resulted in our team being awarded the Massachusetts Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing's Outstanding organization of the Year Award (Department of Psychiatry – DeafYes! Program).
  - My research on mental illness and addiction disability also focuses on a common disability that results in stigma and most severe health disparities and other impacts.
- **Education:** Have taught classes and workshops on EDI issues for faculty, staff, and students.
  - Developed a Spirituality Assessment lecture for all UMass medical students in 2007 that became a core ongoing lecture as part of the effort to enhance cultural competence.
- **Clinical Services:** Have focused on expanding clinical services to meet the needs of underserved populations considering the social and environmental determinants of health, health disparities, and racial justice, including community outreach, engaging the community in creating multi-culturally based clinical services (family based treatments, couples based treatments, etc) and for addiction services. Great impact on Tobacco Addiction services in New Brunswick NJ to engage the community (ex. Increased from 2% to about 30% patients who were Hispanic / Latino to match the population of the community through extensive community partnerships).
- **Community Engagement** – in all mission areas. Have served on boards of community-based agencies that focused on URM populations.
